



# Plan to Rescan

## What's happening?

KOZJ-Joplin and KOZK-Springfield are changing frequencies. These changes will happen on the dates listed below:

**KOZJ-Joplin: Saturday, September 1**

**KOZK-Springfield: Monday, September 17**

## What does it mean for me?

That depends on how you watch TV.

- If you watch OPT via an antenna, you will need to rescan your TV set to continue watching. After you rescan your set, you'll continue to find OPT on the same channel on your TV.
- If you subscribe to cable or satellite TV you do not need to rescan; your service provider will do it for you.

## What do I need to do?

If you watch via an antenna, you will need to rescan your TV or converter box on the date listed above, depending on where you live.

To rescan your TV or converter box:

- Select the **MENU** button on the remote control to your TV or converter box.
- Select **SETUP** on the menu listing.
- Select **ANTENNA**.
- Select **CHANNEL SCAN** or **AUTO TUNE**.

The exact terms you will see during this process may vary based on the brand of your television or converter box. If you have any difficulty, consult the owner's manual for your device or contact customer service for your TV or converter box manufacturer. Once you have rescanned, you are all set. There is nothing more you need to do to receive OPT.

## Why is OPT moving?

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC), which regulates broadcasting, held an auction to reallocate TV broadcast airwaves for wireless internet broadband services. Now nearly 1,000 TV stations are required to move frequencies to make room for wireless internet carriers.

## What else do I need to know?

Because TV stations in our area are moving at different times, you may need to rescan your TV sets more than once. Stay tuned to local channels, or check their websites, for information about each station's rescan date.
